SECOND NATIONAL SEMINAR ON AGARWOOD CUM TREE GROWERS' MELA FOR AGARWOOD FARMERS

Introduction

The North East region of India which is a treasure trove of varied species of flora and fauna harbors matchless plant wealth of endemic species. Aquilaria malaccensis L., locally known as Sasi or Agaru, is a precious floral wealth of this region belongs to Thymelaeaceae family consisting of about 21 species. It is the most expensive wood in the world and hence many a times referred to as "Liquid Gold". The dark brown agarwood or eaglewood which is formed as a result of the tree's immune response to fungal infection is the principal product of the tree. The people of North East India in general and Assam in particular had the knowledge of agar wood or 'Sasi Kath' since ancient times. Its pleasant aroma and costly medicinal values have been the cause of attraction of people since time immemorial. Religious books or "Puthi" written on the specially treated bark glorified its position in the society and people started its plantation in the rear yards of their homes and within the campus of 'Thans' and "Satras". Agarwood and its products are in high demand for medicine, incense and perfume across Asia and the Middle East. Considering the economic benefits of the tree, of late, more and more areas are covered under agar cultivation, which is a very good sign for the rural economy of the region.

Rain Forest Research Institute, Jorhat conducted the 1st National Seminar on Agarwood on 10-11th March, 2015. Now it proposes to conduct the "2nd National Seminar" on Agarwood" on 24th and 25th March, 2022 at Jorhat. The second day of the National Seminar will also be a Tree Growers' Mela for agarwood farmers. The various techniques related to nursery, plantation, artificial inoculation harvest and postharvest processing shall be discussed and demonstrated to the farmers. This seminar will be on a hybrid mode-both offline and online mode and will provide a common forum to the scientists, foresters and managers to discuss various issues pertaining to the conservation, ecology of agarwood-producing species, plant microbe interaction and other stressrelated factors in agarwood induction and formation, and the application of this knowledge to sustainable production, utilization, conservation as well as trade, marketing and policy issues. It will bring players in academia and industry together to exchange the latest information and technologies and strengthen collaboration.

In the Seminar Venue, the Agarwood traders may set-up their stall to exhibit their products and sell them. They need to Register in advance and they will be allotted a space of ft, at the Seminar Venue.

About Jorhat

Jorhat is one of the major cities of Assam. The city acts as a gateway to upper Assam and to the state of Nagaland. It was the last capital of the Ahom Kingdom and home to many historical monuments of Assamese culture. Jorhat is located at 26°45'N, 94°13'E and 26°75'N, 94°22'E. It has an average elevation of 116 meters. In the north of the district, the Brahmaputra River forms the largest riverine island of the world, Majuli, which spreads over 924.6 square km with a population of about 150,000. The cultural diversities which prevailed in Jorhat nearly a century ago has inspired the people to participate in cultural activities through the decades and as a result Jorhat has been able to produce many creative writers, musician, actors, historians and journalists, making Jorhat "The Cultural Capital of Assam". Places of interest in and around Jorhat: Kaziranga National Park, Hoollongapar Gibbon WLS, historical monuments of Sivasagar. RFRI is located about 10 km East of Jorhat City on NH-37 (on Jorhat-Tinsukia Highway).

Connectivity

By Air: Jorhat Airport, commonly known as Rawriah Airport, is located approximately five km from the heart of the town. Jorhat town has flights to Kolkata, Guwahati, New Delhi (via Guwahati) and Bangalore (via Guwahati and Kolkata).

By Rail: Jorhat Town Station and Mariani Junction are major stations of Jorhat. Few short distance trains connect Jorhat Town Station with other places of Assam. All important trains, viz. Rajdhani Express, Kamrup Express, Brahmaputra Mail etc. run through Mariani Junction railway station, which is about 16 km from Jorhat Town. A computerized reservation facility is also available at the Station.

By Road: Jorhat is well connected with all major cities of Northeast India. Jorhat is the only town in upper Assam to have Inter State Bus Terminus (ISBT) service that provides connectivity with other regions of the Northeast with regular buses for major cities and tourist destinations of the neighbouring states. National Highway 37 connects Jorhat with all major cities of Assam. Jorhat is 300 km from Guwahati and it takes about 6/7 hours to reach Jorhat from Guwahati by road.

To discuss and evaluate new ideas on production, extraction technologies and conservation of agarwood.

To promote latest approaches on development of new products from agarwood.

To discuss the policy issues with regard to harvesting, utilization and marketing of agarwood in India.
